I. Course Description

This course is divided into three sections:

- A. Character development and Bible study  
In this course the student will study different books and topics of the Bible.

- B. Bible memorization, prayer, and devotions  
Developing a habit of quiet prayer time with the Lord each day will be a part of the course. During this time he/she will also be memorizing and meditating on scripture.
- C. Serving God and sharing your faith with others  
The student will spend an hour each week serving God. He/she will be an LIT

(Leader In Training) for AWANA.

- A. Character development and Bible study
  1. Student will show development of positive character qualities.
  2. Student will be able to read scripture, study it, and understand it.
  3. Student will be able to apply scripture to their life.
  4. Student will complete the AWANA manual.
  5. Student will read the books of Leviticus, Ruth, Proverbs, Isaiah, Daniel, Hosea, Amos, Nahum, Habakkuk, Malachi, Matthew, 1st Timothy, 2nd Timothy, Titus, 1st John, 2nd John, 3rd John, and give a summary of each book.
  6. Student will complete an AWANA Elective Manual.
- B. Bible memorization, prayer, and devotions
  1. Student will be able to recall scripture memorized when needed for daily living.
  2. Student will develop a personal relationship with God.
  3. Student will be able to see the power of prayer.
  4. Student will seek God's guidance for his/her life.
  5. Student will develop discernment of events in the world and relate them to scripture.
- C. Serving God, personal faith, and sharing your faith with others
  1. Student will be able to share the Bible with children in an interesting way.
  2. Student will become concerned about the salvation and needs of others.
  3. Student will be able to share the Gospel.
  4. Student will realize the importance of Godly character.
  5. Student will be able to resolve uncertainties about his/her personal faith.
